Sellicks Beach Road finishing works

We're doubling the capacity of Main South Road from Aldinga to Sellicks Beach to improve safety and make your journey more reliable.

The \$810 million Fleurieu Connections project is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments.

What's happening

As we progress towards project completion, we'll be undertaking final construction and finishing works on and around Sellicks Beach Road. This includes the construction of the new rest node, final asphalt, line-marking and landscaping works.

How this affects you

From Tuesday 25 November until Friday 19 December 2025 Sellicks Beach Road between Main South Road and Forth Street will be closed **24 hours a day**. During this time, all traffic travelling north and south will detour via Norman Road and Justs Road. Please see map overleaf. Access to local properties and businesses will be maintained at all times.

Some noise disturbance can be expected, but we'll try to keep these disturbances to a minimum. Respite periods will be in place throughout the closure period, where possible. In addition, local access will be maintained; however, we will contact you if the work may directly impact your property.


