Traffic and construction

We have carefully designed and staged construction of the project to minimise impacts on road users.

Minimising traffic impacts

The majority of works will be constructed 'offline' behind the protection of temporary traffic barriers. This will ensure the safety of our workers and road users and allow traffic to flow during construction.

Traffic switches

To construct the new carriageways and upgraded intersections, traffic switches will need to occur.

A traffic switch is when motorists are switched onto a different section of roadway to make space for construction and allow traffic to continue to flow during works.

Planned impacts on the road network

To keep everyone safe during construction, some side roads will be temporarily closed and posted speed limits may be reduced during construction.

Community Engagement

We work with affected stakeholders to ensure that the road corridor and surrounding properties can still be accessed during our road works.

Our traffic management plans are developed with input from impacted businesses, private property owners, road authorities, emergency services and South Australian Police.

Our engagement activities include meetings and briefings with impacted groups and individuals, door-knocking of residences and businesses, and courtesy phone calls. We continue to engage with affected stakeholders while works are occurring and alter our approach where necessary.

Regular works notices distributed

Our latest works, traffic restrictions and detour maps are communicated through works notices. These are circulated via our electronic mailing list and posted on our website.
